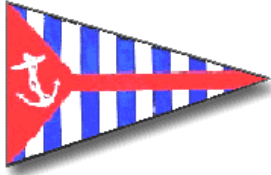

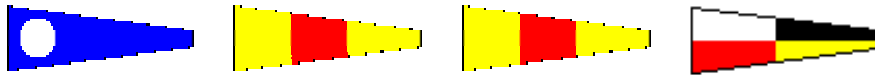

- helping those less fortunate acquire food, clothing, or shelter,

A committee may be appointed to propose revisions to these qualifications subject to approval by the Executive Committee.

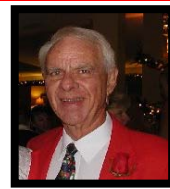

2009 FLEET REVIEW
08 March 2009

Our new Commander, Marcia Militello, S and her Bridge Officers will review the Squadron's fleet beginning at 1115 on 08 March at the Coral Ridge Yacht Club. Members' boats should rendezvous in the Intracoastal, north of the park, at 1045 to receive an instruction sheet specifying their place in the procession and their assigned docking location.

The location of the review along the ICW means the possibility of heavy wakes from passing boat traffic. We have requested a patrol vessel to be in attendance. It is imperative that all captains have adequate fenders and secure their vessels carefully to avoid damage.

The Fleet Review is the yachtsman's ritual and should be governed by the highest standards of yachting protocol. Boats should be in bristol condition with lines and fenders stowed. If possible, they should be dressed with International Signal Flags. All on-board guests must wear appropriate boat shoes. Remember to **bring your camera!**

Fleet Review participants and spectators are invited to a Buffet Brunch following the ceremony at 1230. We will be accommodated in the main dining room. There will be a cash bar outside before brunch.

Please call the Fleet Captain P/C Dean Jackson, SN, at 954-491-0012 to register your boat for review by 25 February so plans can be made for docking, etc.

Use the Fleet Review Reservation Form in this *Newsletter* for both Review and Meal Reservations. Mail to Cdr Marcia Militello, S, address provided.

This event is for ALL members. If you are a new member, join the fun, enter your boat, ride on another member's boat or watch from the lawn of the yacht club. If you do not have a boat, but wish to view the ceremony from the water, please contact the Fleet Captain, who will make the necessary arrangements. If you have space for additional passengers on your vessel, please advise P/C Dean Jackson, SN.

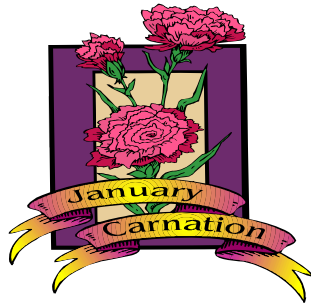

**VESSEL SAFETY CHECK
COMMITTEE**

Our Thanks to Lt Jack McDonough, AP for allowing his important article to be repeated this year.

As 2009's New Year begins for us and it is time to take a look at the Safety Issues that all of us sometimes forget, didn't know, or don't follow. Let's start with having our boats EXAMINED by one of our own Vessel Safety Examiners. We have 3 available for you!!

VISION

Safe, Responsible & Fun Recreational Boating

MISSION

Minimize the loss of life, personal injury, property damage and environmental impact while maximizing the safe use and enjoyment of U.S. waterways by recreational boaters. The Vessel Safety Check process is one of "prevention through education, outreach and volunteer compliance" helping recreational boaters to gain a respect for the boating environment.

The VSC Program also helps to achieve voluntary compliance with federal and state recreational boating safety laws, particularly with regard to the carriage of safety equipment while raising boater awareness about safety and environmental issues through voluntary contact by a Vessel Examiner (VE). VE discussions with recreational boaters are designed to motivate maintaining and operating their boats in a safe manner, taking boating safety courses to increase their knowledge and skills in boating, and promoting safe boating.

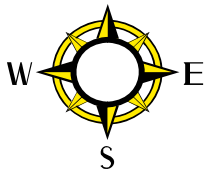
