Now where did THAT come from?

Have you ever wondered where some of the phrases that we use in every day conversation originated? Well, a vast number of them came from seafaring words and phrases.

A common phrase used to encourage is “Don't Give Up the Ship”.

The phrase is attributed to Captain James Lawrence, commander of the U.S.S. Chesapeake in 1813. In this war of 1812, the U.S.S. Chesapeake engaged the British frigate H.M.S Shannon outside of Boston Harbor.

After a short but bloody battle, Captain Lawrence lay mortally wounded. Although his vessel was seriously damaged, he spirited his men on with the command “tell the men to fire faster fight till she sinks, boysDon't Give Up The Ship”.

Although the battle was lost and the U.S.S Chesapeake was finally surrendered, Captain Lawrence's dying words were remembered and found their way into everyday usage.

Beware the Silent Killer

It's 8.00am and you're leaving the dock and heading to your favorite cove for some fun in the sun. By ten o'clock more vessels arrive and anchor nearby. Everyone seems to be having fun; playing in the sand; floating in the ocean and working on that tan.

It's getting late and a couple of friends want to leave. They don't feel well, just a slight headache, maybe too much sun for one day. So you weigh anchor and head for home. Unfortunately the perfect day turns into a nightmare.

We have all heard of the dangers of Carbon Monoxide poisoning. As boaters we are subjected to it more than most and because of that we should be aware of the risk at all times.

Carbon monoxide accumulates in the body and takes 48 hours to be eradicated from the system. It is a dangerous gas this colorless, odorless and tasteless substance. It can leave a person in a great deal of pain and there is no indication this is happening until it's too late. A long weekend on your boat could end up as a bad trip.

Be aware of the symptoms. A headache is usually the first sign to appear followed by other symptoms. These can include nausea, weakness, dizziness, irritated eyes and a feeling of sea sickness. The feeling of sea sickness can often be confused with a feeling of intoxication. If any of these symptoms occur seek fresh air. If the condition worsens seek immediate medical attention.

Anything that burns fuel will create the carbon monoxide gas. Gasoline engines, propane and charcoal are the most common. Good ventilation on your vessel is vital. Wind direction plays an important factor in this growing problem and needs to be an important consideration. Your exhaust may be under control but the boats anchored upwind may not. A carbon monoxide detector is recommended but for sources outside of your vessel may be unreliable.

Beware of your surroundings and keep YOUR boating experience from becoming a headache.

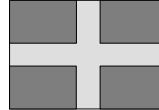
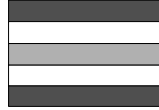

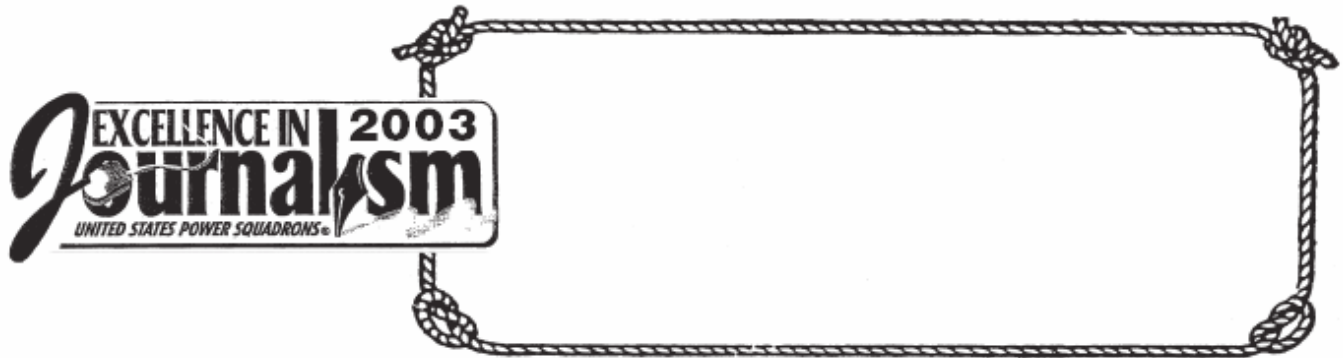
